



Bible Colleges For Pennies!

When you and I think of College it follows that lots of money is involved, loans, payments, etc. However, this is not always the case. I would like to walk you through some of the steps that we use to plant a Bible College on the Mission Field.

1. Defining Discipleship - Here is the core item! Jesus disciplined a few men; not crowds. Paul had a few men around him in his travels whom he trained for ministry, as did Peter in Acts 10-11. If we will embrace this, then our Churches can easily become Training Centers for a few. Over the years the few can become many.
2. Finances - If Churches use their own Buildings, and their own Staff, the cost goes down to very little. After all, targeting 1-15 students will mean that there is not as much need. We develop and provide the Initial Books. They own the materials once they arrive. Students share Books and pass

them on to the next incoming student(s).

3. Once the decision is made to proceed, we begin to research the materials available in the Language of that area. Books are selected and the Curriculum developed. We have published some of the materials ourselves.
4. All Materials Gathered - At this point we put it all together. All books and materials are gathered and readied to ship. Books and Training Materials are Not-Consumable. We package curriculum to be passed on to the students which are coming behind. Books are not to be written in so that they can be passed on. This keeps the cost extremely low.
5. Shipping - Materials are shipped and Shipping options are chosen according to need. Sometimes it is more expensive if non-dependable Post is not available.

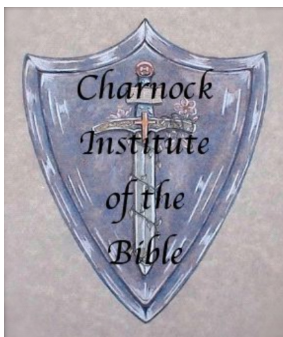

PLAN NOW FOR THIS COMING SUMMER



Summer session is **REQUIRED** for all Degree Seeking Students attending CIB. Translating the entire Greek, Hebrew and Aramaic Scriptures takes more time than a regular schedule can offer. CIB instituted Summer sessions from the beginning to meet this need. Students will need to come into CIB with

their first classes being Greek or Hebrew Grammar. This allows for the Reading the Greek or Hebrew Text immediately in Regular Session. Four Summers mean Four Languages: Greek, Hebrew, Aramaic, and Latin to bring their educational abilities to the College Level. Nothing opens the eyes to the Bible like getting behind the veil of the Translations. English is not a Friend of the Hebrew or Greek Text! Students will never read the Bible in the same way again. 1. The Proctor - This person is in charge, and once the materials arrive he goes into action. Materials are created to be used in two ways. 1. They can stand alone without a Professor. This means that Students take the materials and workbooks home and each week are tested on the work. Or, 2. They can be used in a regular class format (this is obviously best). Classes are only two days a week. There are 4 Classes plus Ministry each Semester for full time Students. It is DISCIPLESHIP remember! The goal is not the degree, but rather the training of men to go to the nations. Still, a Proctor must be in charge to see that assignments are completed, grades are recorded, and books are turned back in.
2. Students are to serve at the Church where they are being trained. Ministry Is A Class! They serve 5-10 hours weekly. This becomes a small Staff which will relieve along side of the Pastors of the Church. They serve as assigned.
3. The Classes and School year are designed to fit the Nation, its Culture and Schedules. We must stay legal! The dates are on the Calendar so that consistency is obtained.
4. The Next Year - We provide materials for only a few students initially. Once the year is completed, we provide the materials for the next year. This means that if any students drop out, we provide only for ongoing students. Some may operate only a One Year Program. This is certainly fine.

Though Brief, this is our pattern for Bible College Plants. You can join us in this process at any time by Going, Helping, Praying, Recommending, Supporting and Attending our yearly Banquet.

WHY SHOULD TRANSLATION FROM THE GREEK AND HEBREW TEXT OF THE BIBLE BE SO IMPORTANT

QUESTION: Why would anyone want to spend 4 years learning to Translate the Entire Bible as part of their Biblical Degree?

ANSWER: Because Greek and Hebrew will NEVER wear English Clothing! English Bibles read nothing like Hebrew or Greek. How could they? They are altered into expressions that an English Speaking person can understand. English IS NOT HEBREW OR GREEK. Interpretation takes place first BEFORE the Translation Process is begun. So the Order is:

1. Reading the Raw and Literal Words of the Biblical Text as they were read and heard and understood by the original audience; not as read and heard and understood by English speaking audiences.
2. Initial Interpreting (Initial Interpretation) the Words of the Biblical Text as written in Greek and Hebrew. The Interpretations should be the one understood by the Author and the Audience at the time it was written.
3. Translation of the Biblical Language into English. Here determining what must be left behind and what must be added comes into play. There is NO ENGLISH GREEK OR HEBREW WORD FOR "of." Yet it will be inserted more than 30,000 times into any English Translation so that it makes sense. The original authors and audiences NEVER once heard the word!
4. Interpretation of the English Bible. Note that this is the Secondary Interpretation, and not the Initial or Primary Interpretation. It is the Interpretation of the Translator's Interpretation. You are Interpreting not what the original

text says, but rather what the English Reading gives you.

We began Charnock Institute of the Bible with this in mind. So a Graduate BEGINS Pastoring or Teaching the Bible with his Interpretation of the Entire Greek and Hebrew Text as his foundation. Then, he can move into the Secondary Interpretation of explaining to his listeners the Biblical Meaning in English. All the while he know what IS and what Isn't actually in the Biblical Text. There is so much more to say, but we will end here. Come and See for yourself!
